OBJECTIVES

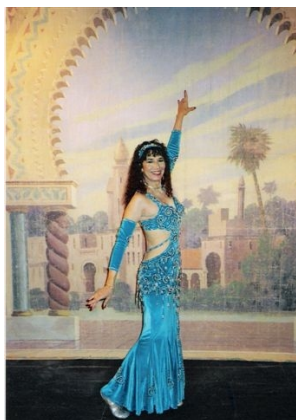
In order to advance the cultural understanding of students, the Journey Around the World will:

- Engage students in age and gender-appropriate activities in various art forms as a way to learn more about various cultures.
- Foster the appreciation of each art form as it relates to the social structure, history, geography, economy, beliefs and values of a culture.
- Promote understanding of various peoples by comparing other cultures to their own in both material culture and intangible aspects.
- Improve the self-esteem of participants by helping them learn more about themselves while discovering other cultures.
- Promote good health and agility by engaging the body in enjoyable exercise.
- Promote aesthetic growth by helping participants develop skills in music, dance, art, writing and theater.
- Enrich the learning of core academic subjects by linking them with the arts – thus providing an outlet to various forms of intelligence and thinking processes.

ACTIVITIES

Program activities are designed for any group – including K-12, college, and adult education. K-12 programs are aligned to state educational objectives. Activities include:

- Study and implementation of the techniques used in each art form (music, movement, theatre, & writing)
- Exploration of the impact of geography, history, climate, and available resources have on each culture's art forms
- Discussion of how art, dance and music are outlets for the creative aspect of humanity in all societies, from ancient times to the present
